At 21:10 hours on June 19, 2007, The Tamworth Fire Department responded to a garage fire at 2757 Chinook Trail in Tamworth. The garage was fully involved on arrival of the first engine and was a total loss. There was no damage to the house. One member of the household received minor injuries attempting to extinguish the fire himself. Mutual aid was received from West Ossipee and Madison Fire Departments. The fire was declared under control at 21:31 and all units were clear of the scene at 23:22.

The garage belonged to one of Tamworth's volunteer firefighters. He was home at the time of the fire, made the call to Carroll County Dispatch reporting the fire, and initially had command of the incident.

The cause is under investigation. Arson is not suspected.

Tamworth firefighter injured, loses garage to fire

TAMWORTH — A Tamworth volunteer firefighter suffered smoke inhalation while trying to extinguish flames in his garage Tuesday night.

At 9:10 p.m. on Tuesday, the Tamworth Fire Department responded to 2757 Chinook Trail and found the garage fully engulfed in the blaze, according to a press release issued by Fire Chief Stephen Solomon. According to Solomon, the garage, which was 70 feet from the volunteer firefighter's house, was a total loss. No damage occurred to the home.

Solomon would not identify the volunteer firefighter, but noted the firefighter attempted to put the fire out himself before reporting it to Carroll County Dispatch.

The West Ossipee and Madison fire departments provided mutual aid. The fire was under control by 9:32 p.m.

Although the cause of the fire remains under investigation, arson is not suspected, according to Solomon.
